PTF-26 The Last U.S. Navy PT Boat

One of the most exciting events was to support a special request from the Paducah, KY-based Maritime Pastoral Training Foundation. This non-profit organization owns PTF-26, a 95' Vietnam-era Navy gunboat. This vintage PTF-26 is the last American PT boat ever built.

The request was made to Council President Jeff
Leibowitz to help move the ship from Port Everglades
to Port of Palm Beach and find dock space for one
month in the Port of Palm Beach. The Navy Leaguers
who helped move the boat were Council officers Jeff
Leibowitz, Stephen Rousseau, Denise Rousseau, and
new members Craig Siegler and Nina Pucillo. Council
Member Dr. Jean Enright was instrumental in helping
secure dockage at the Port, and we thank her for her
efforts.





The 40-mile trip had its adventure, with adverse weather and mechanical issues that diverted the voyage from outside to up the intercoastal waterway. The crew's duties included standing watch, maintaining course and speed, and ensuring safe passage through the bridges.

PTF-26 will remain at the Port of Palm Beach through February 23, 2024. The Board is working on scheduling boat tours, and information will be sent if and when we can arrange security to access to the Port. The boat will move and be overhauled in Mobile, AL, becoming a training vessel for Sea Scouts, Sea Cadets, and NJROTC cadets.
